Terms used within this document:¹

ARRA— American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Stimulus Bill). The ARRA allocates funds that can be spent following the guidelines in ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965) and/or IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act).

In the chart that follows:²

- The “Specific Allocations” column shows the amount of money awarded to a category of spending within ARRA.
- The “Applies to” column indicates the acts that will govern the spending of the funds.
- The “Professional Development Reference” column shows the specific items within ESEA or IDEA that relate to Professional Development.
- The “MH Professional Development Resources” column lists MHPD existing resources that can be purchased with those funds.
